

A Game for Two Players By Jerri Wickert and Molly Smith

Materials needed

Make two sets of cards for two players numbered 0-9 on two different colors of card stock. Cut them apart and give each student a set of cards to use. Each person will use one set of the colored cards.

Directions

- · Each player mixes up their set of cards places them face down in front of him/her.
- The players take turns drawing two cards from each other's hand.
- Add the two number on the cards together.
- Compare the sums. The player with the larger sum scores 1 point.
- Players place these cards on the table and again pick two cards.
- If a player runs out of cards before someone earns 10 points, they are to pick up the cards in the pile on the table that have already been played.
- Continue to play until one player earns 10 points.
- The first person to reach 10 points is the winner.

Extensions

- Column addition (pick 3 or more cards)
- Subtraction...each player subtracts the smaller number from the larger one. The player with the larger difference scores 1 point. The first player to reach 10 points is the winner. Or... smaller difference scores 1 point.
