Users		Varying the use of the innovation to increase the expected benefits for self and clients
	4A	Routine
		Using the innovation routinely yet putting forth little effort and thought to improve use
		and its consequences
	3	Mechanical Use
		Focusing effort on the day-to-day use of the innovation with little time for reflection;
		primarily directing effort toward mastering tasks required to implement the innovation
	2	Preparation
		Preparing for the first use of the innovation; not yet using it
ers	1	Orientation
onusers		Seeking or acquiring information about the innovation
_	0	Nonuse
		Little or no knowledge about the innovation, no involvement with it, doing nothing
		toward becoming involved with it
